### We Moved Our Starting Line and We Just Got Older

These days everyone would like to be a little younger. Selfishly, we would like to subtract some age and history, but keep the wisdom. That scenario is nice to daydream about, but life doesn't subtract. It just adds and adds. Especially if you are Long Stanton Manufacturing Co. Inc.

For the past 40+ years, we have proudly trumpeted our 158+ years of providing metal stamping services to companies around the world. Our story was simple and colorful starting in 1862 with the stamping of metal coins that provided businesses and their customers with a viable way of purchasing goods. But, what we thought was a solid historical starting point, has turned out to have actually begun 27 years earlier in 1835.

While researching Long Stanton's history, Marvin Cunningham, the 6th generation President, happened upon some records and literature that identified John Stanton as the purchaser of the business founded in 1835 that Marvin's family had originally assumed just produced Mr. Stanton's early coins. And just like that, we are 185 years old which makes us 2 years older than our well known Cincinnati neighbor, Proctor and Gamble.

Marvin jokingly commented "We have figured out how to get older. Now, if we could only find the Fountain of Youth we would be set. I'll keep researching."
